Ordinary Time: An Anglican Guide to the Season after Pentecost

It's the time when we all go Green.

We call this time between Pentecost and Advent "Ordinary Time". If you're like me, the title suggests Ordinary time as "boring time". But that certainly is not the case. These Sundays are named in order and so we have "Ordinary Time", but they are by no means ordinary.

Entering into an Anglican church during this time, one sees splashes of green everywhere, from the wall hangings to the vestments the priest wears. Green is the colour of God's creation, so during this time the theme of the readings focuses on the life of the Church as it lives and grows in the midst of the world.

Unlike the other Seasons of the Church, this long period of Ordinary Sundays is not connected to a particular theme as the other Seasons of the Church year are.

In **Advent** we await the coming of Christ; during **Christmas**, we celebrate his arrival; and at **Epiphany** we proclaim that Christ is revealed to the world as Messiah. During **Lent** we prepare for Jesus' death by walking with him to the Cross; then at **Easter** we celebrate his Resurrection. The cycle is completed with the celebration of the coming of the Holy Spirit at **Pentecost**.

But **Ordinary Time** does not celebrate a particular time in the life of Jesus. Instead, it is a time for growth, a time for us to listen to Jesus' teachings in parables and proclamations, a time for us to learn from his encounters not only with his disciples but also with those who are often referred to as "outsiders", a time for us to focus on the public life of Jesus and honour the mystery of Christ in all its fullness.


The "Greening" of the Church takes place when we focus on ordinary people coming to faith in both the past and present; in our lives and in the lives of those who share our earthly journey.

"Ordinary Time" might well refer to living out our "ordinary" lives as Anglican Christians. But, since we follow the Risen Lord of the Universe, there's nothing "ordinary" about it!

We didn't know then how dynamic, wonderful and fruitful the following two years would be for us all. Their commitment to our parish in their many and various roles included:



On 27 September the celebrations continued when Nancy and her daughter, Beth, joined the Cuppa Time group for morning tea at Curly's on the Boardwalk.






Book of the Gospels

The replacement of the entry deck

The erection of a new sign

In late 2021 we were informed that the sign at the front of the church had to be lowered as it was considered hazardous. That meant we would need an expensive LED sign to replace it and despite seeking grants none were forthcoming.

On Monday 17 January 2022 there was a car accident after a driver had a 'medical episode'. The car came down Greenoaks Avenue, crossed Beach Street, narrowly missing the telegraph pole, drove through our sign and hit next door's wall which collapsed. It was a miracle that nobody was injured and the only damage was structural.

The long process to replace the sign.:

In February 2022 an insurance claim was lodged with the Diocese. In March Beaumont Signs quoted \$34,870 for a replacement sign. In September Council approved the sign. In November the insurance funds came though. In February 2023 half the cost of the sign was paid to Beaumont Electrical. In March Beaumont Electrical advised the sign was undergoing manufacture in China which would take 30 days. It would then be shipped and should arrive in about 6 weeks, then it would be held in customs in Brisbane for a week. It would then be tested and fitted to aluminium powder coated frame. In June the artwork was approved

We sincerely thank both organisations for their support.



PARISH AND COMMUNITY OUTREACH

The SOS Pantry provides food and other essentials for vulnerable people in our community

The items required are: 6 packs of UHT milk, 1 litre cartons of UHT milk, muesli bars, plain and savoury biscuits, pull-top tinned meals, small cans of fish (eg tuna) small cans of spaghetti and baked beans, cups of noodles, bottled water, small packs of cereal, fruit in jelly cups, jars of honey, Vegemite and peanut butter/paste, cheese and biscuit combined snacks, 4 pack of Butane Gas..

The search for a new Priest-in-Charge is continuing. Three parishioners have been appointed to liaise with our bishop to appoint a new priest. Please make this search a priority for your prayers.

VOLUNTEERS URGENTLY NEEDED

As several parishioners have moved away and others have retired after many years of service volunteers are urgently needed for the following jobs that make the services each Sunday happen.

Readers

The readings are printed out each week and placed on the lectern, with the correct introduction and end for the reading. If you prefer, to read from the Bible ribbons are placed at the relevant page in the Bible.

Sides people Arrive at church by 8.30am

Greet people at the door and hand out books and pew bulletin.

Ask two parishioners to take the elements (carafe and ciborium) up to the altar.

Count the number of people present.

Take up the collection, hand it to the LA and advise LA of the number of people.

Sacristan

On Friday or Saturday prepare the items which are to be used on the altar during the Sunday service. There is a list on the wall in the Vestry of what is required and a photo of how the tray should be set up.

Mark the readings in the Bible on the lectern with the seasonal coloured ribbons.

Change the banner and Bible ribbons if necessary – check Roster sheet for seasonal

colour.

Put the hymn numbers and psalm number on the board.

After the service on Sunday:

Take down the hymn & psalm numbers.

Wash the wash up delete chalice and other items used during the service in very hot

water.

Take the linen used during the service and any other linen that is in the box on the bench in the vestry home for washing, ironing and return during the week or the

following Sunday.

Flowers

On Friday or Saturday arrange flowers for the service. This can be done in conjunction with sacristan duties.

Counting

After the service collect the offertory from the table in the sanctuary, count it, write it up in the deposit book and put it in the safe or give to Margie

Morning tea Set up for morning tea before the service and serve it after the service.

Liturgical Assistant. - If you would like to become and LA please speak to Fr Richard or one of the current LAs.

None of these jobs are onerous - they just need you to give a little time every so often. The more people who volunteer the less often we all have to do the tasks.

As the proverb goes: Many hands make light work.
